

Why did Jesus choose Judas Iscariot? Perhaps to—



- Warn each person to examine whether or not he is saved.
- Illustrate that an unsaved person can live and work in a godly atmosphere and remain unsaved.
- Show that it is not always the fault of the leader that followers go astray.
- Demonstrate how people can live during Christ's millennial reign and not be saved, though they talk and act like Christians and are not troublemakers—until Satan is *"loosed a little season"*—Rev. 20:3. Then they turn against Christ, even as Judas betrayed Christ at the end.

A disciple obeys and follows the Lord Jesus.

Disciples must avoid

- **Lying**—includes deception, cheating, etc.
“... putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour”—Eph. 4:25.
- **Stealing**—“Thou shalt not steal”—Exo. 20:15.
“Let him that stole steal no more”—Eph. 4:28.
- **Disobedience to authority**—parents, supervisors, policemen, etc.
- **Swearing**—or taking God’s name in vain—Exo. 20:7.
- **Filthy talk, dirty jokes, or suggestive language**—
“Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth”—Eph. 4:29.
- **Drugs, alcohol, and tobacco** harm the body.
- **Sexual sins**—fornication and pornography are forbidden in scripture.

“And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them”—Eph. 5:11.
